REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

April dollar volumes were 10% better than prior year with Alberta and Atlantic recording the most significant increases, and BC flat compared to last year. The almost universal increase belies the uneven start to the season across the country, with the Prairies, Quebec and Atlantic regions all experiencing unfavourable weather and delayed openings, while BC, Alberta and most of Ontario had typical spring conditions and starts.

Strong transaction growth continued in the month, and the YTD totals are now 12.7% higher than in 2022.
