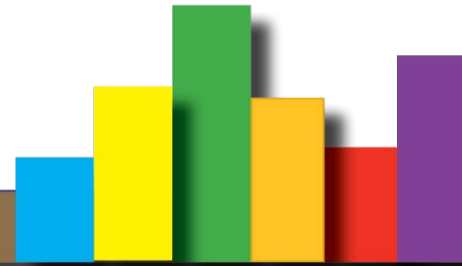

### REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

The 2024 golf season has seen a varied start, with different regions experiencing unique challenges and successes. While the slow start persisted in some areas, others showed promising increases.

In terms of performance, three regions showed declines from 2023, while three regions exhibited growth. Alberta experienced the most significant decline with a 21.6% drop, largely due to uncooperative weather, which resulted in an average of seven closures. Conversely, Quebec led the gains with a notable 21.6% increase, benefiting from more stable weather conditions.

Despite these mixed results, there are several positive trends to highlight. National year-to-date numbers for rounds played are up 4.9% from the prior year, demonstrating overall resilience and growth. Moreover, play levels in most regions continue to exceed five-year averages by over 20% for the month and 28% year-to-date.
