REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

Opening dates for the 2020 golf season varied from early May in Alberta to as late as May 20th in Quebec due to COVID-19 public health measures. This year most provinces were open; some with public health restrictions limiting golf to same-household only while Ontario remained closed until May 22nd due to public health measures implemented in mid-April.

Overall, rounds played increased by 34% Nationally with Quebec leading the way with rounds almost tripling its 2020 level.

YTD figures are even better with an 86% increase Nationally due to early openings in many regions, no May closure mandates, and favourable spring weather.

Comparing to 5-year averages, rounds remain up, except for Ontario, by 13% for May, and by 25% for YTD.
