### REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

YTD rounds played continue to show increases over the record-setting levels of play in 2020 with all regions reporting double-digit increases apart from Ontario at +3.7%. Nationally, YTD rounds played are showing an increase of 10%. This result reflects more play than 2020 in the April - June period and then slightly less play than last year in the July - September quarter.

Quebec (+5.3%) and the Prairies (+6.7%) were the only regions in the month of September to see an increase over September 2020. Rainy weather conditions in both British Columbia and Ontario played a factor in the slight decreases in those regions while Alberta and Atlantic Canada were impacted by the changing COVID situation.

Compared to 5-year average levels, the Prairies and Alberta remain 30% higher than the September norm, with Québec next at 27%. Nationally, the YTD average rounds played is 24% higher than the 5-year average level.
