Highlights

- Weather in September showed improvement compared to earlier months of the 2024 season. All operator scores exceeded previous monthly values, and average course closures were significantly reduced.
- Year-to-date, the coastal regions have reported the best weather scores and the fewest closures, with slightly more than one week of play lost. In contrast, Alberta experienced 23 closures, equating to over three weeks of lost play. Central regions are close behind, with an average of 21 closures in Ontario and 19 in both the Prairies and Quebec.
